

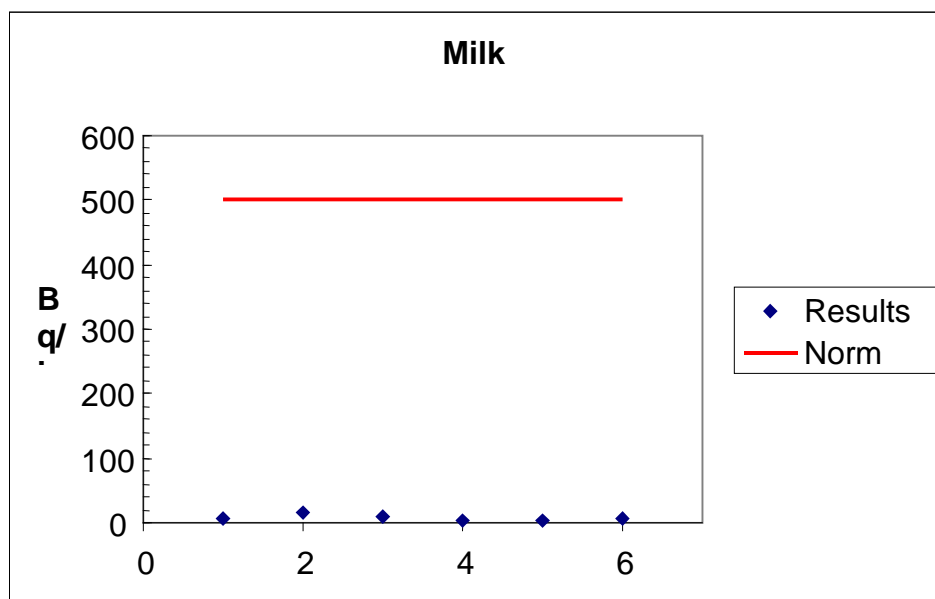
To the persons concerned,

On Thursday, August 28<sup>th</sup> 2008 at 5.00 pm, the FASFC was informed by the government crisis cell about the alert in Fleurus. An incident had happened at the IRE during the weekend of 23 August 2008.

That same day 28/08 in the evening, the FASFC went to take six milk samples in the 5 km-zone.

The results of the analyses were known on Friday, 19/08/2008. They all appeared to be conform, and even quite under the norm.

The highest found value was 17 Bq/kg, thus by far under the EU-norm of 500 Bq/kg.

Since milk has never represented any hazard for the public health, the FASFC did not impose at any moment a restriction for commercializing milk.
